Effective Date	This Tariff applies from 1 July 2018
What is licensed under this Tariff?	Protected sound recordings
What uses are covered by this Tariff?	<p>This Tariff covers the playing of protected sound recordings at events that are not covered by any of the other specific Tariffs.</p> <p>The issuing of licences under this Tariff is discretionary, based on PPCA's determination that no other Tariff applies, and its consideration of whether it is appropriate to issue a licence under this Tariff.</p> <p>Events for which PPCA may consider it appropriate to do so include the following (to the extent they do not fall within another Tariff):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) fetes, garden parties and similar events;</li><li>(b) school or church concerts;</li><li>(c) dance academy concerts; and</li><li>(d) presentations/performances by motivational speakers.</li></ul> <p>Note: The protected sound recordings must not be used in any manner where it could reasonably be regarded as suggesting an approval, affiliation or endorsement by an artist or group of the licence holder's business or goods/services.</p>
What are the Licence Fees?	Either: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>(a) \$148.05 per annum, for all events that are covered by this Tariff; or</li><li>(b) \$64.04 for a single event.</li></ul>
Licence Period	Annual

PPCA will generally increase Licence Fees with effect from 1 July of each year, in line with the movement in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) since the date of the last increase or review. CPI increases will not be notified to Licensees separately, but will be applied to all invoices issued on or after 1 July in each year. Any increase in Licence Fees as a result of a broad or structural review of a Tariff will only be implemented following a period of consultation with the affected industry sector.
