



<b>Public Performance Tariff K:</b>	<b>Amusement centres, pool rooms, swimming pools and ten pin bowling centres</b>
Effective Date	This Tariff applies from 1 July 2018
What is licensed under this Tariff?	Protected sound recordings
What uses are covered by this Tariff?	<p>This Tariff covers the playing of protected sound recordings for the background musical entertainment of patrons at amusement centres, snooker/pool halls, squash centres, swimming pools, ten pin bowling centres and similar establishments.</p> <p>This Tariff <u>does not</u> cover the playing of protected sound recordings:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ at Nightclubs (as defined in Tariff E1), Dances or Dance Parties (as defined in Tariff E2);</li> <li>▪ in bar areas (covered by Tariff M) or restaurants (covered by Tariff R1);</li> <li>▪ through jukeboxes (covered by Tariff J);</li> <li>▪ to accompany fitness classes (covered by Tariff V); or</li> <li>▪ where venue is used for Music Events and Festivals (Tariff E4).</li> </ul> <p>This Tariff also <u>does not</u> cover the public exhibition of music videos (covered by Tariff W).</p>
What are the Licence Fees?	<p>\$85.99 per annum for each room or other area where protected sound recordings are played.</p> <p>If a venue has more than one room or other area, then each of those areas incurs a separate fee at the rate specified above.</p>

**ALL LICENCE FEES UNDER THIS TARIFF ARE PAYABLE IN FULL, ANNUALLY IN ADVANCE. ALL AMOUNTS ARE INCLUSIVE OF GST.**

PPCA will generally increase Licence Fees with effect from 1 July of each year, in line with the movement in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) since the date of the last increase or review. CPI increases will not be notified to Licensees separately, but will be applied to all invoices issued on or after 1 July in each year. Any increase in Licence Fees as a result of a broad or structural review of a Tariff will only be implemented following a period of consultation with the affected industry sector.
